SBA to Provide Disaster Assistance Loans for Small Businesses Impacted by Coronavirus (COVID-19)







SBA Loan Assistance:

On March 6th, congress passed the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2020 making \$1 billion available to the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to provide low-interest loans to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, and nonprofits that have suffered substantial economic losses as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Whitmer notified the SBA that she is seeking an Economic Injury Disaster Loan Declaration for the state and has initiated the process to receive the declaration from SBA. Once granted, small businesses in qualifying areas will be able to access low-interest loans through the SBA

If you think you may want to explore an SBA Loan, while you are waiting to officially apply, we are recommending small businesses that could benefit from SBA loans to start collecting the information they'll need to complete their application.
